

VENICE

Experience, paint and photograph the watery magic, maze-like configurations of breathtaking "Venezia". Paint Murano and Burano Islands in the Venetian Lagoon. Piazza San Marco is surrounded by splashy and historical buildings. The piazza is filled with music, lovers, artists and pigeons. By day it's full of travelers and by night it is your private rendezvous with the Middle Ages.

LUCCA

Lucca is encircled by massive red brick walls, which help to give the city its special character by shutting out traffic and the modern world. Paint and sketch the panoramas from the forty-foot thick walls. Rent a bike and find the best view to paint from the city walls. Romanesque churches seem to be around every corner, as do fun-loving and shady piazzas. The city was a Roman settlement. The grid layout of the streets and the shape of an amphitheater survives from Roman times.

PORTOFINO

Portofino is the most exclusive harbor and resort town in Italy, filled with the yachts of the wealthy. Above the town is the *Church of San Giorgio*. Portofino is truly a painter/photographer's paradise.

PORTO VENERE

Named after Venus herself, Portovenere is one of the most romantic villages on the Ligurian Coast with its cluster of narrow streets lined with pastel-colored houses. In the upper part of the village is the 12th century *Church of San Lorenzo*.

CINQUE TERRE

The Cinque Terre is a protected stretch of rocky coastline on the Riviera of Levante which extends from Monterossa al Mare to Riomaggiore at its southeastern tip. The name refers to five dramatically situated villages that literally cling to the very edge of vertiginous cliffs: Monterossa al Mare, Vernazza, Corniglia, Manorola and Riomaggiore.

SAN FRUTTUOSO

Abbey of San Fruttuoso, named after a 3rd century saint whose followers were shipwrecked here and, according to local folklore, protected by three lions. The white abbey buildings, set among pines and olive trees, date mostly from the 11th century. The Ligurian Sea, at the stunning harbor cove of San Fruttuoso, is truly "viridian green" and crystal clear.
